I give, devise and bequeath the lot of land and
dwellings in which I now reside in Picton aforesaid to my son
George Anderson for and during the term of his natural life
should his wife Mary E. Anderson survive him, she shall have
the use and occupancy of the said lot of land and buildings
during her lifetime provided she remains unmarried. At her
death, or in the event of her being married I give, devise and
bequeath the said lot of land and buildings to my son Charles
Anderson.

I give, devise and bequeath the furniture owned by me
in said dwelling house to my son George Anderson aforesaid.

I direct that my Executrix above named do sell either
at public or private sale the two lots of land owned by me,
situate on the north side of the road leading to Barry's Mill
and with the proceeds pay my funeral and testamentary expenses
and any debts due by me.
