

A native of the Isle of Tiree, Scotland, The Bard Maclean came to Nova Scotia in 1819. He settled at Barneys River, Pictou County. It was here he composed, A CHOILLE GHRUMACH - the Gloomy Forest. In 1831 he removed with his family to Glenbard, Antigonish County. He died and was buried there in 1848.



Maclean Lament

Red Hector of the Battles is the official Lament of Clan Maclean.

He was the sixth Chief of the Macleans and was killed at the Battle of Harlow in 1411.

Bard Maclean is a descendant of Red Hector of the Battles.
