In the name of God, Amen,

I John Beaton of Pleasant Valley Middle River, in the County of Pictou, Province of Nova Scotia, Dominion of Canada, being at present in poor state of health, but of sound mind and memory, reflecting on the uncertainty of life, do make and ordain this my last Will and testament, revoking all former wills.

Nearly disposing of whatever property may belong to me at my death, I order that my body be decently interred and that all my just debts be fully paid and funeral expenses,

I Bequeath to my son Basil Bell Beaton the South west part of the farm on which I reside joining Adams McKezies lot of land, thence North East from Adams McKezies until it comes to a drain and a brook clear rods from the barn on the North East end of the barn on my farm at present and the line when surveyed to run parallel with Adams McKezies line from front to rear and the same course as the present line and the said lot of land is supposed to contain from ten to fifteen acres more than the one half of the whole farm.

I order that my son Basil Bell Beaton is to have all the farming implements and waggons and sleighs of whatever nature they may be at the time of my death and all the cattle sheep and horses excepting one horse. I order that my son Basil Bell Beaton is to have ~~the~~ ^{the} farming implements and ~~support~~ ^{support} my wife Mary Beaton during her ~~life~~ ^{life} in a manner becoming her station in life as a dutiful son ought to do. And also she is to have the garden in front of the house and at the back and the park of the house that we reside in.

at present and two cows and four sheep as long
as she remains a widow. I order that my son
Basil Bell Beaton to give one Cow to Annie my
daughter and one Cow to Ruth my daughter
and one Cow to Ella my daughter -

I Bequeath to my son Walter W.
Beaton living at present in the United States of
America all the remaining part of the farm on
which I now reside namely the North east side
joining George Sutherland land thence South west
from Sutherlands scattill it comes to the aforesaid
drain and brook and Elew rods from the end
of the barn and joining Basil Bells. I order that
son Walter W. Beaton is to have one horse.

I order also that if my son Walter
W. Beaton wishes to sell and wish to reside on his
part of the property and wishes to sell he is to give
the first offer to any of his Brothers and Sisters wh a
sum not exceeding four hundred dollars, said property
however to be subject to the due fulfillment of the
terms herein mentioned.

I do hereby appoint as my true and lawfull
Executors for duly fulfilling and Carrying into
effect the dispositions of this my last will and
testament Alexander Ernie of Four mile Brook
County of Pictou, Carpenter and Adam M. Keuzie
of Pleasant Valley Pictou County Farmer.

Giving and granting unto them all power as
Executors by law may require.
