

Pictou, Nova Scotia, do hereby make this my last
Will and testament as follows.

I give and bequeath to John M^r. Dougal all
my grandson, and son of Thomas M^r. Dougal of
Stellanston, that certain lot, piece or parcel of land
situated, lying and being on the west side of the
Cask River, and which is abutted and bounded
as follows, (as described in deed dated the twentieth
day of Dec. One thousand eight hundred and
Eighty six) that is to say, Beginning at a stake now
placed at the north of the road or footpath of our
Joseph Baker, and running from thence by the
Magnet north Eleven degrees east two chains and
thirty links to a stake there placed, thence north
Seventy nine degrees west two chains and eighteen
links to another stake there placed, thence South
Eleven degrees west two chains and thirty links
to another stake there placed, thence South Seventy nine
degrees east two chains and eighteen links or to the
