

Sixth, I order and direct that the property owned by one of the two one, Blanchard, if unsold at my decease, shall be sold by my executors when such sale will be approved by a majority of my surviving heirs.

Seventh - I give devise and bequeath unto my son Thomas M. Donald that certain lot of land situated at Plymouth, purchased from George Little and recorded in the registry office Pictou, Book G D. Pages 479, 480, & 481, said property to revert to Thos. M. Donald at the death of my wife until then to be hers.

Eighth - I order and Command that out of the proceeds of my estate all my legal debts be paid and funeral expenses and that any residue then remaining shall be equally divided among the surviving heirs, and hereby appoint James N. M. Donald of Bridgville and Thomas D. M. Donald of Plymouth my executors of this last Will & testament.

I John M. Donald of Stillarton in the County of Piton, being conscious of the uncertainty of human life and being of sound disposing mind & memory do make and publish this my last Will and testament.

First. I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife \$800 Catharine M. Donald eight hundred dollars, the same to be invested for her benefit by my executors hereinafter mentioned and that I shall draw from that fund and the interest accruing a sufficient and adequate amount for a comfortable maintenance during her natural life, the same to be drawn from time to time as required and paid over to her by my executors, and it is further ordered that any remains of this bequest at the death of my wife may be equally divided among my surviving heirs as defined in this instrument, and further that my beloved wife Catharine is to have and hold the homestead now owned and occupied at Stillarton together with all my real and personal property during her natural life.

Second. I give devise and bequeath unto my son \$300 Simon M. Donald three hundred dollars.

Third. I give devise and bequeath unto my daughter \$200 Margaret M. Donald two hundred dollars.

Fourth. I give devise and bequeath unto my daughter \$200 Mary Jane M. Donald two hundred dollars.

Fifth. I give devise and bequeath unto my Grand \$100 daughter Sadie M. May the sum of One hundred dollars.
