












THEIR MAJESTIES AT SAINT JOHN, N.B.


GREETED BY 10,000 SCHOOL CHILDREN






FAREWELL TO CANADA




THE KING shakes hands with Rt. Rev. L. J. A. Melanson, Archbishop of Moncton.












