I George Walker, Minister of the Gospel, in New Glasgow, within the County of Pictou, Nova Scotia, being of sound mind and memory, and taking into account the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of Death, do make public and Declare, this to be my last Will and Testament, and as to such monies and Property, wherewith it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me, I dispose of the same as follows -

1st I order and direct my body to be plainly and decently buried by my Executors, in the cemetery below the town, and by the side of the remains of my beloved wife Jean Neagh, and the expense thereof to be paid, as a first claim on my effects.

2^d I give, demise, and bequeath, to my 3 (three) sons ~~Andrew~~ Robert, and George, and to my 3 daughters Sarah Forbes, Ann Callander, and Mary Jane McMay, all that certain tract of land, purchased from Rodrick McGregor, and minutely described in the Bill of Sale, of date one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven (which see) containing Ninety four square Rods more or less, together with all Houses, Outhouses, and buildings, to the same belonging, or in any wise appertaining, but if George Joseph McMay should desire to purchase the above property, with all the buildings thereon, he shall have it, upon payment of the sum at which it is valued by the last property assessors of the Town, and the money thereby realized shall be divided among my sons and daughters, giving to each of them an equal share,

3^d I give and demise and bequeath to my

all that certain tract of land, purchased from
Roderick McGregor, and minutely described in the
Bill of Sale, of date one thousand eight hundred
and fifty seven (which see) containing Ninety four
square Rods more or less, together with all Houses,
Outhouses, and buildings, to the same belonging,
or in any wise appertaining, but if George James
McMay should desire to purchase the above property,
with all the buildings thereon, he shall have it, upon
payment of the sum at which it is valued by the
law property assessors of the Town, and the money
thereby realized shall be divided among my sons
and daughters, giving to each of them an equal share,

4th I give, demise, and bequeath to my 3 sons

Janet Forbes, Ann Callander, and Mary Jane McKay
whatever money, more or less, is in the New Glasgow
Branch of the Bank of Nova Scotia, each child, Boy
and Girl, to receive an equal share of said money,

5th I nominate and appoint my son Andrew
Walker, and my son in law George James McKay,
to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament,
