last will and testament
First I devise my body decently
interred and there all funeral expenses
to be defrayed out of the estate left by me
Secondly I give devise and bequeath
unto my beloved grand daughter Isabella
Stewart the household now occupied by
me and kept by her containing
dwelling house and out houses and
premises also all the household
furniture and tableware utensils
with out any reserve for less or more
and benefit of grace

I also devise and bequeath unto the
said Isabella Stewart the sum of two
hundred Dollars Bank the same to be
paid by my executors out of money
deposited by me in Bank

Thirdly I give devise and bequeath
unto my beloved grand son John
Stewart the sum of two hundred Dollars
out of deposit in Bank already
referred to

Fourthly I give devise and bequeath
unto my daughter Agnes wife of
a B. Gay two hundred Dollars
Cash out of said Bank deposit

Fifthly I give devise and bequeath
unto my son Robert White one
Dollar as he has received during
my life from me the sum of two

hundred Dollars

legally I ordered appoint James W
Garrett and Son to carry
both of Stillman's operations of
this my last will and testament
I find the said and delivered at the
request of the Testator and the witnesses
in his presence and in the presence of each
other signed upon this and the 11th day
of October in the year 1900
