My real estate of whatever kind including my dwelling house, I bequeath to my wife, Eliza Jane Smith, during the term of her natural life, provided she does not again marry, but if she marry, the said real estate and dwelling house shall be the joint property of (her and) my two children John George Smith, and Lydia Matilda Smith.

I order that on the death of my wife my real estate and dwelling house shall be the joint property of my two children before named or the sole property of the survivor of them and in the event of their Mothers Marriage, shall the property immediately revert to and become the sole property of my children before named, or the property of the survivor of them.

I hereby declare this to be my last Will and Testament revoking all others.

Testament.
