I William Jones Clark of West River in  
the County of Tipton in the Province of Tennessee  
Solemnly avow being of sound and disposing  
mind and memory do make and publish  
this as my last will and Testament hereby  
revoking all former wills and testamentary  
dispositions heretofore at any time  
by me made.

I hereby appoint my brother Rev Daniel  
McD Clark and my wife Caroline  
Clark to be the executor and  
executrix of my will.

I hereby direct my said executor and  
executrix to pay all my just debts  
funeral and testamentary expenses as  
soon as possible after my decease  
and erect a suitable tombstone  
to my memory.

I hereby give devise and bequeath  
to my two sons Aubrey Harris Clark  
and Daniel Smith Clark jointly  
and equally all my personal property  
and real estate of every kind  
whatsoever of which I may be  
possessed at the time of my decease.

That I said Aubrey H Clark and  
David S Clark are to enter into  
possession at my decease of the  
personal property and real estate  
herein willed to them on the  
following conditions to wit  
They work together on the lands

devised to them and unitedly labour to  
Sustain the home and household as  
I have hitherto done until the  
decease of my wife Sarah in 1846  
that in lieu of dower they shall  
support their mother and provide  
her with necessary food clothing  
Medical Care and attendance  
and every usual comfort of life  
with the use of horse and Carriage  
when needed by her and with the  
use and occupancy of one half  
of the old home with furniture therein  
if she desires it and to pay to her  
twenty Dollars per year during her  
whole life, and that they shall des-  
cend a place in the lot with their  
mother to my daughter Emily when  
she needs it or until married and  
that they shall give a home and  
maintenance to my daughter Warren  
Oliver and Mary until and an  
education sufficient to enable them  
three children to make a living  
for themselves when they be  
twenty one years old or until they  
are able to provide for themselves  
Married or leave the home of their  
own accord.

The above conditions must be  
performed to the reasonable satisfaction  
of my executor and all other parties

then the properties devised and  
bequeathed herein shall become the  
lawful possessions of the said Aubrey  
& Clark and David S. Clark their  
heirs and assigns forever otherwise  
the said properties may be taken  
or taken by any execution or  
execution for the purpose of fulfilling  
the said conditions
