In the name of God Amen.

I James Clisk being infirm in bodily health, and having attained an age approaching the time allotted to human life consider it a duty incumbent on me while of sound disposing mind and memory to make this my last will and Testament.

I desire to commend my spirit to the God who gave it, believing in Jesus Christ, who is the resurrection and the life and hoping for salvation through his atonement.

My body I desire to be decently interred in the Family enclosure in the Cemetery of "Christ Church" there to rest until the resurrection of the dead.

First, I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Margaret Gardiner the two storey dwelling house being the homestead in Stillartown with all barns and outhouses and lands attached as now owned and occupied by me. To Have and to hold said property for her use and benefit and behalf.

I desire order and command that my said daughter Margaret Gardiner shall pay or cause to be paid the following bequests which I devise unto the parties herein after named and that she will well and truly discharge these obligations in such manner and times as herein after named in all amounting to One Thousand Dollars.

To my son Thomas three hundred dollars payable in three equal installments at six, twelve and eighteen months after my death.

To my son Robert she is to pay Two Hundred dollars payable in two equal installments

at six and twelve months after my death,

To James and George the two eldest of my
son James children she is to pay one hundred dollars
each when they attain the age of twenty one years, and
in the event of the death of either before that period
the amount requested shall revert to the survivors
of the family.

To my Grand daughter Maria Adonia
she is to pay one hundred dollars when she attains
the age of twenty one.

To Mrs. William Mc Donald she is to
pay one hundred dollars payable six months
after my death.

To my son William she is to pay
one hundred dollars payable in monthly instalments
of five dollars each, the first to be payable six
months after my death, being in all the aforesaid
sum of one thousand dollars.

I give devise and bequeath unto my
daughter Margaret Gardiner all the household furniture
beds and bedding Carpets and Cooking utensils
and all articles of furniture not otherwise dis-
posed of by this instrument.

I give devise and bequeath
unto my son Joseph all the property owned by me in
Westville, namely four Houses and lots attached as
appears on reference to title deeds of the same, out
of which property he the said Joseph Clish is to
pay to his eldest son Gardiner Clish one hundred
dollars when he attains the age of twenty one years.

I give devise and bequeath unto
my son Gardiner the silver jug owned by me,
which I desire him to return to the one formerly
received to George Ward. I also devise and bequeath
unto my son Gardiner the broose head belonging
to me.

I give devise and bequeath unto Mrs William
McDonald 1 silver cruet stand, also all the tratts
made by her during the time she was in my service.

I give devise and bequeath unto Geo Ward
One silver Nickel dish

To my son Thomas one silver Butter Cooler

To my Grand daughter Maria Sidonia 2 doz. dearth silver spoons

To Margaret Clish (his daughter) One silver Cake Basket

To my son Thomas my Gold watch with attachment

To my son Robert the three silver watches and

One Gold watch owned by me

I give devise and bequeath unto my Grand daughter
Margaret Clish his daughter One hundred dollars

To my Grand daughter Elizabeth Clish his daughter Fifty dollars

To my Grand daughter Margaret Ward Fifty dollars

To my son James Widows if unmarried One hundred dollar

To my son Robert I give devise and bequeath the sum
of Three hundred dollars there last bequest to be
paid by my executors out of my estate. The money in
bank to be withdrawn by them for that purpose, and
the stock not otherwise disposed of sold, to pay off
these claims

I hereby appoint my son Gardner Clish
and Donald Jay Executors of this my last will
and Testament and have only to instruct them to
Comply with the requirements of this instrument
and carry out this my last request to them faithfully
and impartially, to which I affix my signature this
twenty third day of July in the year of our Lord one
Thousand eight hundred and eighty
