

GENERAL REGISTER

The full names (not initials, nicknames or diminutives) of Pupils must be neatly entered in this table, with their exact ages, on the first day of the School year, August 1st. These, with the Pupil's number which must remain unchanged during the year, grade at beginning, and the parent or guardian's name and address, must be filled in when the pupil is enrolled. The remaining columns must be filled in before the Annual Return is made at the close of the year. In Graded Schools, when a pupil enrolled in this page is transferred out of this department into another department within the same school section, the name, number, address, etc., must still remain without cancellation; but in the columns 161, 162, 163 and 164 there must be written neatly in contracted form (instead of the figures, etc., indicated by their headings) the intimation of the transference of the Pupil into the new department, thus: "Transferred into 4th Dept."—contracted: "Tr. 4th Dept."; or thus: "Tr. to IV. East" or "Tr. to 7th Dept., St. Patrick's," &c., &c., as the case may be—the contracted name of the department being made as brief as required for the short space. It must be carefully remembered that a Pupil's attendance is not transferred out of one department until it is entered into the register of the other department. If a Pupil simply leaves school with the intention of entering another department, or if he attends school in another school section, there is no transference. His name and attendance, etc., must all remain on this page. (There can be no transference out of or into schools, therefore, in School Sections with only one school; and in such schools, of course, the "rectified" attendance will be the same as the "Days" attendance.) The names, etc., of those (whose attendance is transferred out of the school) must neither be counted nor entered in the Annual Return of this department. For further explanations see last page.
