Blanchard's Will 1876

Know that the said Will was testamentary of George
Foster of Blanchard in the County of Pictou and
Province of Nova Scotia, Farmer.

1st I commit my soul to Almighty God for time and
Eternity.

2nd I devise and bequeath all the Real Estate
to which I shall be entitled at the time of my
Decease unto my Brother Donald without Condition
on his part.

3rd I desire that all the Personal Property to which
I shall be entitled at my decease such including
Furniture Clothing be sold by my executor at
Public Sale or otherwise as they may see fit
to the best advantage of my personal Clothing and
part of my best clothing I bequeath in the following
manner.

To Mrs. Mary Foster one Black Newspaper
dress & shawl. To Mrs. my brother's wife one bed
Cover, & double Blanket, one single Blanket and
one Chaff bed, also one Black woollen shirt.
To Jessie, John's daughter, my blue Dress and my
brown shawl. To Johanna my sister I bequeath the
best of my mitts & the Working chain table. One
Cloth Cover, also one best quilt, one double Blanket
one single Blanket, one Chaff bed, also my
brother's shawl, and one of my best made shawls.
One linen sheet and table Cloth, one flannel shirt,
one orange shirt, and my best Coburg Dress, my
best luster Dress, I bequeath to Charles Ross, Peter
Ross' daughter, my other home made shawl for
John my brother's wife. To Mary my sister I bequeath
my spinning wheel with the block also the
small wares in my trunk not mentioned
here, to be divided between Mary and Johanna.

also for Mary one linen sheet and table cloth,
the Lamp and the looking glass & pressure dish
for John my sister, the balance of the District
to be divided between her and Mary.

To Archy Fraser John my brother one sheep with
the double rod truck and for John my brother 3
leash chains also for John's wife one linen sheet
sheet and sheet and linen table cloth.

All other articles not otherwise mentioned
to be held by the executor.

I further devise that my Executors
after paying the expenses of a decent Christian
Burial for me, and also all my lawful debts
will provide for my Father and Mother a respectable
Headstone to mark their last resting place, and
also for myself a Headstone to mark my last
resting place, both suitably inscribed, also
to put on our Burial lot a respectable fence
fence fenced.

I further request to the Foreign
Mission of the Presbyterian Church of the Lower
Provinces all the money then or hereafter may come
of the proceeds of my Estate after complying with
the above bequests for the benefit of the Mother,
Cathy, I appoint Peter Ross, John and William
Tanner, John Ross Executors to this my last will
and hereby revoking all other Testaments or
writings in witness whereof have hereunto set
my hand and seal.
