considering the uncertainty of life Do make
and ordain this my last will and testament.

To my well and dearly beloved wife Annie
Fraser I give devise and bequeath all my
real estate and personal property of whatever
nature and kind and wherever found for her

And I do hereby nominate and appoint
my said wife Annie Fraser together with
Alexander Fraser Farmer of Sutherland
River County and Province of Nova
joint-executors of this my last will
and testament, and I do hereby
revoke cancel and annul any and
all former wills by me made and do
declare this to be my last will and testament.
