Knows all men by these presents, that I John Gurn
of Hopewell in the County of Pictou and Province of
Nova Scotia, Postmaster, Considering the uncertainty
of this life and being of sound mind and memory
Do make and declare and publish this my last
Will and Testament.

First. I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved
daughter Catherine Ann Gurn, The House and
Barn and two acres of land adjoining the Home
stead, The residue of the field enclosed, supposed to
be ~~over~~ ^{one} acre of land if not disposed of during my
life time then to revert to my son Daniel Gurn
of Boston.

Second. I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved son Colin
A. Gurn that certain lot of land on the East side
of the road leading to Stellarton between the lands
of the heirs of the late Alexander W. Donald,
and that of John Fair, containing seventeen
Acres out of which land I reserve one acre which
if not disposed of during my life time, then to
revert to my son Daniel Gurn of Boston.

I also devise and bequeath unto Colin A. Gurn
my Horse, Cow, Farming utensils together with
the use of one half the Homestead bequeathed to
my daughter Catherine A. Gurn during her
natural life if required.

I devise and order that at my decease and in
Case of Colin A. Gurn through infirmity or
sickness, becoming mentally or physically
unable to transact his own business or take care
of himself, I devise my son Daniel Gurn of Boston
to assume the full power and authority of
Guardian over his estate, and if necessary dispose
of such as may be required for his maintenance
and support —

Third - I give devise and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Annie Gumm daughter of the late John Gumm of California, Twenty Dollars. (\$20.⁰⁰/₁₀₀)

Fourth - I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved Son Daniel Gumm of Boston, Two Hundred Dollars. (\$200.⁰⁰/₁₀₀)

Fifthly & } I order and devise that James
Lastly - } Keith of Stollarton be sole executor of this my last Will and testament, and I desire that all monies deposited in Bank or other security that can be realized after the payment of funeral expenses, and that of any other legal debts, the residue or balance may be equally divided between the members of my family then living, that is to say Daniel Gumm, Colin A. Gumm, and Catherine A.
